Whether you're exploring historic towns, or indulging in local delicacies, Puglia offers a slice of Italy that is truly unique.



SINCE OUR FIRST JOURNEY TO MYSTERIOUS PUGLIA, The Travel Club has discovered there's even more to explore in this southern, sun-soaked province. Join us in "the real Italy" as we reveal the art, culture, tradition and cuisine of Puglia. Our home base during this vacation is the charming hill-top town of **Ostuni** – known as the White City for its stunning white buildings and offers panoramic views of the surrounding countryside and the Adriatic Sea. The historic center is a labyrinth of narrow, winding streets perfect for exploring and lined with shops and restaurants. Renowned for its olive oil, burrata cheese, fresh seafood and pasta dishes, Puglia is a food lover's paradise. Our excursions include elegant **Lecce** - an "open air exhibition" of Baroque architecture - where we'll have lunch and enjoy a Tarantola performance; and a visit to seaside **Otranto** with its massive Aragonese castle. Explore the unique character of **Alberobello**, famous for its trulli—traditional stone huts with conical roofs—and a UNESCO World Heritage site that feels like stepping into a fairytale. Visit the vibrant port city of **Bari** and the stunning coastal town of **Polignano a Mare**, known for its dramatic cliffs,

crystal-clear waters, and charming old town. Enjoy the morning at **Masseria Seppunisi** - an historic farmhouse featuring traditional architecture, characterized by stone walls, a rustic aesthetic, and surrounding agricultural land. Meet the cows of the dairy herd, view the dairy, visit the cellars and watch a demonstration on how mozzarella and burrata are made and even have an opportunity to craft your own cheese – followed by a tasting of the farm’s cheeses, focaccia, cured meats and a glass of the local wine. In the afternoon we’ll visit the charming farmhouse of Masseria Casina Vitale for a cooking lesson followed by dinner. We’ll end this amazing trip with a visit to Matera - a unique and historic city renowned for its ancient cave dwellings known as "Sassi." It is one of the oldest continuously inhabited cities in the world and has been designated a UNESCO World Heritage Site.

Accommodations

Ostuni Palace Hotel

With its impressive façade, Ostuni Palace fits in perfectly in the White City of Ostuni. Located in the heart of the historic center, it offers a spa and a restaurant. All rooms are air-conditioned and have free WiFi. Rooms have a classic and elegant design with wood or tiled floors and fresh color schemes. Each one has a mini-bar and a TV with satellite and pay-per-view channels. A daily buffet breakfast is provided. The Ostuni Palace Bistrot restaurant serves contemporary dishes with regional ingredients. Vegetarian options are also available. Guests can unwind at the modern Ostuni Palace Spa equipped with a hot tub, a sauna, and a Turkish Bath. Sensory showers, a relaxation area, and massages are also available. The spa uses natural products. Offering panoramic views across the town's whitewashed buildings, the Ostuni Palace is 10 minutes' walk from the main square.



Day 1: Departure from Boston

Evening departure from Boston on ITA Airlines, non-stop flight to Rome. There will be meal service aloft.

Day 2: Arrive Rome - connecting flight to Brindisi - transfer to hotel in Ostuni

Upon arrival at the Rome airport we'll clear immigration/passport control and transfer to our connecting flight to Brindisi. Upon arrival we claim our luggage and clear customs and are met by our Tour Manager who will direct us to the motorcoach for the transfer to the **Ostuni Palace Hotel** in Ostuni. Enjoy a welcome drink and this evening we'll have a welcome dinner with wine at the hotel restaurant. **(D)**

Day 3: Full-day excursion to Lecce and Otranto

After breakfast we depart on an excursion to **Lecce** - often called the Florence of Southern Italy with its stunning baroque architecture, vibrant cultural scene, and rich history. Lecce is like an elegant, sumptuous, open-air exhibition of Baroque art. Among its countless monuments: the wonderful façade of Santa Croce, Piazza del Duomo, one of Italy's most beautiful squares, Sant'Oronzo square and the Roman amphitheatre. Enjoy lunch at a local restaurant and a Tarantola performance. Later, we'll visit **Otranto** - a picturesque coastal town and the easternmost town in Italy. Return to the hotel. **(B L)**

Day 4: Alberobello & Locorotondo

Depart on a half-day excursion to **Alberobello** to see the famous Trulli of Alberobello, picturesque cone shaped houses that take you back in time to a traditional countryside lifestyle. Needless to say, Alberobello is a UNESCO world heritage site. Afterwards we'll head to Locorotondo - a charming hilltop town known for its stunning whitewashed buildings, narrow, winding streets and picturesque architecture. Enjoy lunch at a local restaurant. **(BL)**



Day 5: Bari & Polignano a Mare

After breakfast, we'll depart on an excursion to **Bari** where we'll have a guided visit of the old town, including the Cathedral. This charming area of narrow streets, restaurants and shops is the home of Orecchiette: a traditional Puglian pasta shape, often served with broccoli rabe or tomato sauce. Transfer to the stunning coastal town of **Polignano a Mare**, renowned for its dramatic cliffs, crystal-clear waters, and charming old town. Enjoy lunch at a local restaurant before we return to the hotel. **(B L)** **Bari**

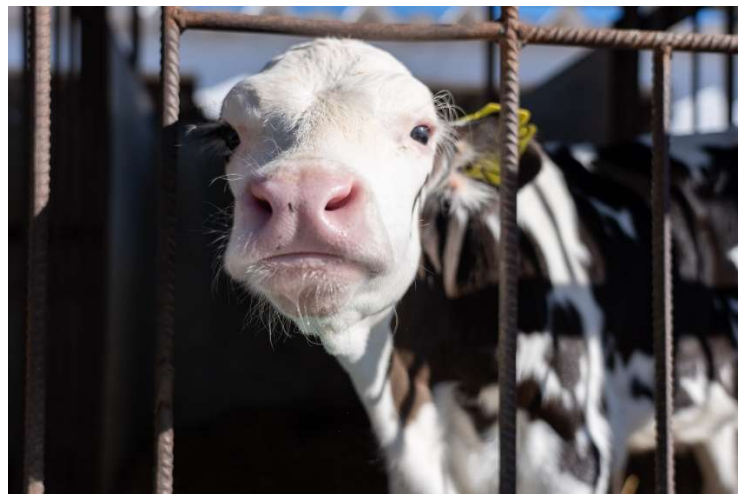

Day 6: Experiential visit to Masseria Seppunisi

Today's incredible adventure takes place at an historic farmhouse - nestled in the breathtaking scenery of the Valle di'Itria and the dei Trulli – and featuring traditional architecture, characterized by stone walls, a rustic aesthetic, and surrounding agricultural land. At this four-generational farm you'll be able to meet the cows of the dairy herd, view the dairy, visit the cellars and watch a demonstration on how mozzarella and burrata are made and even have an opportunity to craft your own cheese – followed by a tasting of the farm's cheeses, focaccia, cured meats and a glass of the local wine...the authentic flavors of Puglia. Later this day we'll venture to the **Masseria Casina Vitale** for a cooking lesson followed by dinner. **(B L D)**



Day 7: Excursion to Matera

Today we'll journey to Matera, one of the most spectacular cities in Italy and one of the oldest inhabited cities in the world. Matera is made up of rock-cut caves in which its citizens have traditionally lived. The town was named a UNESCO world heritage site in the '90s, and was named one of the European Union's two Capitals of Culture in 2019—quite the coup considering its post-World War II reputation as "the shame of Italy." We'll enjoy a guided visit of the "Sassi," followed by lunch at a local restaurant. Enjoy a farewell dinner at a local restaurant tonight. **(BD)**



Matera, Basilicata's jewel, may be the third-longest continuously inhabited human settlement in the world. Natural caves in the tufa limestone, exposed as the Gravina cut its gorge, attracted the first inhabitants perhaps 7000 years ago. More elaborate structures were built atop them. Today, looking across the gorge to Matera's huddled sassi (cave dwellings) it seems you've been transported back to the ancient Holy Land. Indeed, the 'Città Sotterranea' (Underground City') has often been used for biblical scenes in films and TV. The sassi, many little-more than one-room caves, once contained such appalling poverty and unthinkable living conditions that in the 1950s Matera was denounced as the 'Shame of Italy', and the sassi-dwellers were moved on. Only in later decades has the value of this extraordinarily built environment been recognized.



Day 8: Return to Boston

This morning transfer to Brindisi airport for our flight to Rome and our transatlantic flight back to Boston. **(B)**
